Location: Clemson, SC

• # of Undergrads: 22,400

• Acceptance Rate: 38%

• Student / Faculty Ratio: 16:1

• Returning Freshmen: 92%

• % Receiving Merit Aid: 39%

INTERESTING FACTS:

- More focused on undergraduates than most public universities
- Tight knit campus in a small town location with lots of spirit
- 1,400 acre campus surrounded by another 17,000 acres of farms and woodlands
- Known for biology, computer engineering (especially robotics), veterinary sciences;
 great direct admit nursing program
- Big on undergraduate teaching and undergraduate research (54% take part)
- 53% of classes have fewer than 20 students
- 16% of men and 31% of women participate in Greek life
- Blue Ridge Mountains close by for hiking and camping
- Friendly students who love big-time sports!

COLLEGE IN THE SPOTLIGHT: JAMES MADISON UNIVERSITY

Location: Harrisonburg, VA

• # of Undergrads: 18,772

• Acceptance Rate: 76%

• Student / Faculty Ratio: 17:1

• Returning Freshmen: 89%

• % Receiving Merit Aid: 2%

INTERESTING FACTS:

- Public university with a focus on undergraduate teaching and close student/faculty interaction; classes feel relaxed and supportive
- 75% of students are in-state
- Strong in pre-professional programs in business, health professions, and education.
 Nursing program is not direct admit; students apply at the end of their first year (200 apply for 130 slots)
- Student support services get high ratings; strong counseling center with a range of offerings
- Honors College for those looking for a more intense experience
- Freshmen required to live on campus; meal plan gets rave reviews
- Lots of school spirit and minimal Greek life.

THOUGHTS FOR SENIORS:

Most seniors I know are hard at work on their college applications. Many have realized just how tough the fall of senior year can be; academics have ramped up, and they're often busy leading extra-curriculars or sports teams. And many regret not getting more done over the summer (take note, Juniors!)! But, if they **work slowly and steadily**—instead of waiting last minute to write supplemental essays—they **still have time** to put together solid applications.

Students should let their guidance counselors know if they plan to apply Early Decision or Early Action. Most schools and counselors have deadlines around this; please be considerate of their time!

THOUGHTS FOR JUNIORS:

Juniors and their parents should do their best to get on several college campuses this fall. Visiting when college students are on campus is best; it's very hard to get a sense of the vibe of colleges when they're not. Don't worry yet about visiting colleges that you might apply to. Instead, focus on visiting a mix of sizes (from huge to small) and locations (from urban to rural). Without making these visits, it is VERY HARD for students to figure out what they are looking for in a college. And when you're visiting, be sure to drive around the perimeter of the campus, and listen for laughter (a sign that kids are happy and interacting with each other!). AND ask whether anyone can join clubs (at far too many colleges, there is an application process to join clubs, and it can be quite competitive).
